

BILL TO OVERHAUL SEX ED IN MICHIGAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

What's at Stake Right Now & What Parents Need to Know

Did you know? A bill has been drafted to radically overhaul the way that Michigan's public schools teach children about sex education, gender, identity, and reproductive rights. If passed, this legislation would affect approximately 1.3 million in nearly 3,000 public schools across the state. Did you know that parents no longer sign permission slips for sex ed? It is taught automatically, unless a parent proactively excuses their child from the class.

What MI Schools Currently Teach (MCL 380.1169, 380.1507, 380.1507b)

- Teaches that abstinence "is a positive lifestyle for unmarried young people"
- Teaches self-control and responsibility, healthy relationship skills, how to set personal boundaries, and how to say no to peer pressure
- Focuses on reducing "the rate of [adolescent] sex, pregnancy, and sexually transmitted infections
- Prevents dispensing of contraceptive drugs and devices on public school property
- Prevents teaching "clinical abortion" as a "method of family planning
- Includes clergy on local sex ed advisory boards
